

REPORT ON THE 2025 BATCH C, CORPS MEMBERS PRODUCTIVITY AWARENESS LECTURE HELD AT NYSC ORIENTATION CAMPS ACROSS NIGERIA ON THE 1ST OF DECEMBER, 2025.

The National Productivity Centre (NPC) Abuja on the 1st of December,2025, in synergy with its 20 state offices, conducted a nationwide productivity awareness lecture for NYSC Batch C corps members at orientation camps across the country. The lecture forms part of the Centre's ongoing Productivity Awareness Campaign, designed to instil a culture of productivity among young Nigerians. The initiative aims to equip them with the mindset and discipline necessary for self-reliance, enabling them to make meaningful contributions to national development, particularly in the face of high unemployment rates. Through the knowledge gained, corps members are expected to strengthen and sustain the entrepreneurial skills acquired during the orientation program, positioning them to thrive in both self-employment and the larger workforce.

OBJECTIVES OF THE LECTURE

The main objective of the Productivity Awareness Lectures for NYSC Corps Members is to arouse their consciousness on how to improve Productivity through promotion and practices. They are also encouraged to initiate Productivity improvement activities in their various places of primary assignments, so as to accelerate growth and development in the country.
